Walkway and Drop Off Zone

- All pedestrians, cyclists, scooter riders and skateboarders, please use the pathway on the Owhata School side of our turf.

We recommend every student has their own digital device. This can be a Chromebook, iPad or laptop.

Uniform

Our uniform consists of a range of serviceable items, easily layered for extra warmth, which are readily available at the Warehouse.

Additional notes:

- Caps and beanies navy blue with no insignia.
- Socks navy blue and black

- Tights (winter) must be navy blue and not footless tights.
- Footwear Black covered-in shoes for Technology all year round. Black lace-up leather shoes are preferable, although black canvas shoes are permitted. Black soles and black laces. Covered in shoes are compulsory for technology classes. No gumboots.
- Black roman sandals or other sandals with back strap.(No jandals or slides.)
- School uniform to be worn to and from school.
- P.E. uniform to be worn for all fitness and sports.
- Only jewelry accepted is a watch, plain studs or a taonga.
- Hair must be tied up for physical education and specialist classes for health and safety reasons.

Digital Devices

What device? - We do not specify any one device. Ipads allow students to be creative with photo and film. Chrome books are more cost effective and as we only use online tools, will be all they need. Laptops have more grunt and storage capacity in a hard drive; each student has an online drive in our education domain. We do not install a mobile device management protocol or apps onto your child's device at this point. While we strongly recommend BYOD (Bring Your Own Device), we are aware that not all families can afford their own device, so we have a small supply that can be borrowed from the school library for one school block at a time.

We cater for everything as long as it has a screen over 20 cm and **does not use data**. We concentrate on using digital applications that can be accessed on laptops, chrome books or tablets, iOS or Android.

Your children will bring home a **Digital Device Responsible Use Agreement** which they have gone through with their teachers. **Please make sure you read** the document and sign it. Only then will your child be able to use their own or any school digital device.

Note - All student mobile phones need to be handed in to the office each morning!

Digital Tools - for student use and whanau communication

At Mokoia Intermediate, we use a lot of digital tools, including online assessments. Every student has a **Google Drive** where their work is stored. We have an education domain which has more stringent parameters than a private Google account. Your child has an email address and password controlled by Mrs Hyde, who also monitors all digital use.

Spotlight - Each child also has a **Spotlight** account, which we use as a digital portfolio and communication tool with you at home. An invitation will be sent to you by email, text or on paper,

with instructions about how to join. No other student or parent can see your child's work. We will be transferring from Seesaw, as Spotlight is a feature of our existing student management and we will be able to avoid double handling information.

Communicating with whānau - We ask you to interact with Spotlight as a major source of communication about your class' activities and your student's learning. Messages from the school are also sent out by email regularly and in our weekly newsletter. Sometimes we use text. We have an app on Skool Loop which puts up notices, the calendar and a copy of our school newsletter. Our website can be found at www.mokoia.school.nz. We publicise a lot on our Facebook group, as this is proving to have the greatest reach in our community.

Facebook - Please don't ask to be a friend of Mokoia Intermediate - we don't need to see your private life! Rather, look for the group **Mokoia Intermediate 2022**, and ask to join. This is a private group, access to which is controlled by the senior leadership team. No students currently at school are given access as Facebook is <u>restricted to users 13</u> and over. We ask that you only post photos of students on the school group page.. <u>It is not good practice to post photos of other people's children</u>. We also ask you to direct questions and concerns to the school and not post them here. This is a positive forum, and negative or inappropriate material will be declined or deleted.

Our School Values

Tihi means peak. *Mana* is, in simple terms, self respect and respect from others. Mana exists within all people, from the time they are born till death. Mana can be grown and can diminish depending on one's actions. Mana exists in three forms: *Mana atua* - genealogical mana, *Mana tangata* - personal mana and *Mana whenua* - mana through connection with the land.

Te Tihi o Mana is held up by three *pou* or pillars: *Whakaiti* - humility, *Ūpoko pakaru* - resilience and *Kōmaitanga* - a sense of achievement.

At the centre is Te Au - the self.



Just as a triangle as a geometric shape, has no integrity without each of its pillars, so it is with our values. To have *Tūturutanga* - integrity, we must ensure that we are mindful of the pillars.

Whakawhanaungatanga - relationships, is the cement or glue which keeps the whole together.
