2023 Kiwi Competitions Report

This year the Kiwi competitions were highly contested by over 17,500 students from over 450 schools throughout New Zealand, participating in multiple competitions and year groups. The number of entries to participate continues to grow year on year.

The competitions have been designed for New Zealand primary, intermediate and secondary school students. The curriculum areas covered are English, mathematics and science.

The school results include an overall percentage, percentage scores for different strands of the various curricula, stanine, descriptive grade, national average and school average.

The national percentiles determine the grade cut offs for each competition year group. The grade boundary between 'Participated' and 'Achieved' has been calculated at the 50th percentile (where 50% of all scores nationally are either below, or above it). Please note the 50th percentile will be different for each competition and year group.

For many years we have adopted a policy of including an outdoor education camp as a compulsory part of the school curriculum. Each year we apply for funding to subsidise the cost of this camp and have been successful on most occasions. This year the Board has contributed \$15,000.00 and we applied for funding of \$16,000.00 from Okataina Outdoor Education Centre and Aotearoa Gaming Trust. We have now received the Okataina Trust grant of \$5,000 and the Aotearoa Trust \$10,000.

Mokoia Intermediate have opted into the Ministry of Education donation scheme. However, schools and kura can continue to ask for a donation for overnight school camps. This request is for a donation. Families and whānau can choose to pay the donation in full, in part or not at all. All students will attend camp regardless of whether they have contributed.

Due to the increasing costs of accommodation, buses, food and staff overnight allowances, this year we are asking for a contribution from parents of \$125.00

Without your contribution and the funding we receive through trusts we would be unable to continue to provide this valuable opportunity for our students. We have received \$16,250 from parents but we budgeted to receive \$33,250. Without this we may not be able to run some of the more exciting activities.
