Lakelands Year 7/8 fixtures for 2023-24 Cricket Season (UPDATE)

If you haven't already registered, please remember to RSVP. I have kept the original message below in case anyone missed it the first time around.

Some of you are already familiar with the 'Lakelands' set-up. For those that aren't, Lakelands cricket encompasses players from Rotorua, Taupo, and Whakatane. During the cricket season, we organise fixtures and training for those Lakelands Year 7/8 (and u/16 and u/19) players who want to play extra cricket on Sundays and want to play against opposition from outside their normal competitions.

The Lakelands 7/8 team plays against teams from Tauranga, Cambridge, and various other places around the BOP region (and sometimes Hamilton/South Waikato). Usually, the quality of the opposition is 'step up' from children's normal Saturday cricket. It's not 'every Sunday' – perhaps 7 or 8 fixtures throughout the season. And we generally rotate players so it's unlikely a child would be expected/allowed to play in all of them.

If parents and children want to be involved in this, we're having a training/muster on Sunday 15th from 12:30pm at Ray Boord Park (Rotorua). We're treating this not as a 'trial' but more as an opportunity for kids to get some extra coaching and have a fun game of cricket ahead of Saturday cricket starting. We'll have a couple of coaches there, run some training and depending on numbers have a fun game or two. At the very least it's a good chance for the kids to blow out some of their winter cobwebs – all are welcome to attend.
