WALKWAY AND DROP OFF ZONE

- All pedestrians, cyclists, scooter riders and skateboarders, please use the pathway on the Owhata School side of our turf.
- All caregivers collecting students by car, please follow the arrows to use our drop off zone at the front of the school. Traffic needs to move through smartly. If you need to wait for your child, please park along Brent Road. We ask that you do not expect your child to run across the road, but that you use the pedestrian crossing.
- For health and safety reasons, we ask parents NOT to drive vehicles or walk down the driveway.

BICYCLES AND SCOOTERS

- Bicycle and scooter stands are in a gated area provided for pupils and they must be locked to the stand at all times.
- While in the school grounds, all pupils must walk their bikes and scooters along the footpath.
- All pupils must wear safety helmets when using bicycles.
- Bicycles and scooters will not be stored in the office area or classrooms.

UNIFORM

Our uniform consists of a range of serviceable items, easily layered for extra warmth, which are readily available at **The Warehouse**.

Additional notes:

- Caps and beanies navy blue with no insignia.
- Socks navy blue and black.
- Tights (winter) **must be navy blue and not** footless tights.
- Footwear Black covered-in leather or canvas lace up shoes are permitted. They must have black or white soles and black laces. Covered in shoes are compulsory for technology classes. No gumboots or crocs!
- Black roman sandals or other sandals with back strap. (No jandals or slides.)
- School uniform to be worn to and from school.
- P.E. uniform to be worn for all fitness and sports.
- Only jewellery accepted is a watch, plain studs or a taonga.
- Hair must be tied up for physical education and specialist classes for health and safety reasons.
- Only the school polar fleece and jacket are permitted to be worn. Non uniform jumpers, hoodies or puffer jackets are **NOT** permitted.

OUR SCHOOL VALUES

Tihi means peak. Mana is, in simple terms, self respect and respect from others. Mana exists within all people, from the time they are born till death. Mana can be grown and can diminish depending on one's actions. Mana exists in three forms: Mana atua - genealogical mana, Mana tangata - personal mana and Mana whenua - mana through connection with the land.

Te Tihi o Mana is held up by three pou or pillars: **Ūpoko Pakaru - Resilience** and **Kōmaitanga - Sense of Achievement** and **Whakaiti - Humility. At the centre is Te Au - the self.**



This year we are introducing three new values that were developed within our Eastside Community of Learning (REKA). They are **Whanaungatanga - Relationships**, **Manaākitanga - Ethics** and **Wairuatanga - Spirituality.** The english words have chosen to represent an encompassing understanding of what the value means.

We have been lucky enough to have had Matua Taimona work along side some wonderful members of our community to connect each of these values to an tūpuna within our local iwi, as well as creating reimagined tuahangata and tuawahine to represent them. Each of our school values is also represent by our three house colours – pink, purple and green, and our new values by the colours of the tino rangatiratanga flag – red, white and black.

Over the course of this term each one of these values will be introduced in each newsletter, along with the ancestor connected with it and the meaning behind it. As well as interviewing ākonga and kāiako to see how they see the values represented within Mokoia Intermediate.

We are also introducing a new graduate profile incorporating these values. These are actions we at Mokoia believe students should strive to and have the ability to show before they leave us at the end of year 8. This will also be shared with our community in the coming weeks.

DIGITAL DEVICES

- What device? We do not specify any one device. Ipads allow students to be creative with photo and film. Chrome books are more cost effective and as we only use online tools, will be all they need. Laptops have more grunt and storage capacity in a hard drive; each student has an online drive in our education domain. We do not install a mobile device management protocol or apps onto your child's device at this point. While we strongly recommend BYOD (Bring Your Own Device), we are aware that not all families can afford their own device, so we have a small supply that can be borrowed from the school library for one school block at a time.
- We cater for everything **as long as it has a screen over 20 cm and does not use data.** We concentrate on using digital applications that can be accessed on laptops, chrome books or tablets, iOS or Android.
- Your children will bring home a **Digital Device Responsible Use Agreement** which they have gone through with their teachers. **Please make sure you read the document and sign it.** Only then will your child be able to use their own or any school digital device.

Note - All student mobile phones MUST BE handed in to the office each morning!

DIGITAL TOOLS - FOR STUDENT USE AND WHANAU COMMUNICATION

In 2024 Mokoia Intermediate will no longer be using Seesaw to communicate information and student learning. We are delighted to launch our new communication and reporting system, **Hero**. An online sharing platform with complementary smart app. Hero allows us to customise an online environment that enables teachers, students, and families to view and share content anytime, anywhere on any device. The software is secure, easy to use and brings together all school-related information in one place. By downloading the app you will be able to see your child's profile of achievements and posts. You will also be able to report an absence, have links to our school website, pita pit ordering and our newsletter. You can get more information on this at our meet the

teacher evening; **Wednesday 7th February from 5:30 pm - 7:30pm.** Come along to meet your child's teacher and if you want help getting on board or any more information on how it works we will be there to help.

With Hero, you have the ability to:

- read and comment on posts relating to your child's learning
- view information on your child's progress and goals,
- read and comment on school notices sent to the class or groups your child is part of
- respond to school notices such as surveys and trip permission requests
- view school term dates
- view a school calendar of events
- notify the school if your child is absent or late
- navigate to other school-related webpages
- customise your account by adding a profile image
- select how you wish to receive notifications

Learning posts combined with curriculum information and goal-setting will form an online report designed to build year-on-year so that over time you will have access to written posts, images, video, work samples, and helpful resources all in one place. Over the coming year, staff and students will be posting rich content to our Hero software. We are looking forward to sharing this with you, including you in your child's learning journey. Bear in mind that this is all new for our school, so please make allowances for our staff while they navigate and learn their way.

At Mokoia Intermediate, we use a lot of digital tools, including online assessments. Every student has a **Google Drive** where their work is stored. We have an education domain which has more stringent parameters than a private Google account. Your child has an email address and password controlled by Whaea Kathryn, who also monitors all digital use.

Facebook - For up-to-date posts please look for the group **Mokoia Intermediate 2024**, and ask to join. This is a private group, access to which is controlled by the senior leadership team. **No students currently at school are given access** as Facebook is restricted to users 13 and over. We ask that you **only post photos of students on the school group page**. It is good practice to **not** post photos of other people's children. We also ask you to direct questions and concerns directly to the school and not post them here. This is a positive forum, and negative or inappropriate material will be declined or deleted.
