<u>Some Important Reminders</u>

Student Financial Accounts

This week, whānau will have received an emailed statement outlining their child's current account balance with the school. We would like to begin by sincerely thanking all those who have already made payments.

As communicated earlier, we are asking that all outstanding payments for 2024 and Term One 2025—particularly for sports and voluntary activities such as the RATs Duathlon, Mini Marathon, Productions, and other optional activities—be cleared. These are opportunities students have volunteered to take part in with outside organisations, and they come with associated costs that must be covered by the school.

At the end of last year, the school was carrying a significant amount of unpaid fees, which came at a real cost to Mokoia and continued into Term 1 of this year. In order to sustainably offer the wide range of experiences we're so proud to provide, we need your help to ensure that all of these are paid for.

We kindly ask that all unpaid balances be cleared by Friday 23rd May. Any payments still owing after this date will mean that students will not be able to participate in winter sports codes, voluntary activities, or AIMS Games unless their accounts are up to date. We would like to make it clear that any accounts with a regular automatic payment will be exempt from this.

We understand that student participation in a variety of school activities can result in higher account balances. To make this easier for families, payments can be made through Hero, directly at the school office, or via internet banking.

One helpful option is setting up a regular automatic payment. These are credited to your child's account as "payment in advance" and used throughout the year to cover sports and voluntary activity costs. At the end of the year, you're welcome to choose whether the remaining balance is:

- Rolled over to the next year,
- Reimbursed,
- Or transferred to a sibling still attending Mokoia

If you need support or would like to discuss your child's account, please don't hesitate to get in touch with one of our Deputy Principals. They are here to help and will work with you to make the process as smooth as possible.

We're proud of the diverse range of opportunities available to our students, and we are truly grateful for your ongoing support in helping us continue to offer them.
