Kia ora e te whānau,

The Mokoia Intermediate School Board of Trustees has, today, written to the Minister of Education, requesting the appointment of a Limited Statutory Manager, to oversee certain aspects of the Board's role. A Limited Statutory Manager (**LSM**) is appointed where a school is facing serious issues, including where there is a significant concern regarding a school's operations. This is an unusual step, and not one that is taken lightly. However, the Board feels it has no choice but to seek this intervention owing to a serious situation that has arisen in relation to the upcoming board elections.

#### Concerns giving rise to request for Ministry Intervention

The Board is highly concerned by the nomination of Janet Du Fall, Russell Du Fall and Julie Calnan to stand for board positions as parent representatives. Ms Du Fall was, until April 2025, an employee of the school. Her employment was terminated following what the school considered was an irrevocable breakdown in the employment relationship between her and the Board. There have been ongoing legal proceedings between Ms Du Fall and the Board over a period of years (since September 2023); and Ms Du Fall is currently pursuing both an Employment Court challenge and Employment Relations Authority claim against the school. Russell Du Fall is the husband of Janet Du Fall, and has been actively involved in the ongoing legal proceedings as her support person. Julie Calnan is understood to be a friend/acquaintance of the Du Falls. The Board considers there is a significant concern regarding the school's operations given the prospect of these individuals being elected to the board while Ms Du Fall is actively pursuing legal action against Mokoia Intermediate.

#### What would the appointment of a LSM mean for the school?

Where a LSM is appointed, they take on some (but not all) of the Board's functions. All matters that are outside the LSM's mandate remain with the school's elected Board representatives. The Board has asked that a LSM be appointed with a fairly narrow mandate – to oversee the ongoing matters between the school and Ms Du Fall (and financial matters associated with that); and to manage and respond to any potential conflict of interest issues that arise in relation to the incoming Board. Outside of these matters, our expectation is that the Board and school will continue to operate as normal; and that the upcoming Board elections will take place as planned.

#### What does this mean for my child at the school?

Our expectation is that this step will not affect the day-to-day operation of the school. The Board continues to support our fantastic senior leaders in providing a fantastic learning environment for our ākonga.

#### What should I do if I have questions or concerns regarding this?

We appreciate this step is likely to be unsettling for the community, however we are confident that seeking this intervention is in the best interests of the school. If you have any questions, please don't hesitate to contact the Board by emailing presidingmember@mokoia.school.nz.
