Year 8 Open Days

IMPORTANT WHANAU NOTICE

Kia ora whānau,

Each year, schools across Aotearoa are required by the Ministry of Education to be open for a set number of days. While we carefully calculated these at the beginning of the year, it has recently come to our attention that—because we have only taken the mandatory Teacher Only Days set by the Government—our original closing date of Thursday 11th December is slightly later than we are permitted to remain open.

As a result, we have had to make a small adjustment to our end-of-year schedule. We have done our best to keep this change as close as possible to the original date to minimise any disruption for whānau.

The final day of the school year will now be Tuesday 9th December.

Please note that the end of the year will look a little different from previous years.

What you need to know;

- Week 10 will still be our final week of the school year.
- Monday 8th December: Students attend for a full school day as usual.
- Tuesday 9th December:
 - Prizegiving will begin at 9:30am.
 - Students will finish at 11:30am (at the conclusion of prizegiving/start of morning tea).
- Tuesday 9th December (evening): Students attending Prom will return for their final event from 5:00pm - 9:00pm.
